

**Greek Law N. 927/1979 on punishing acts or activities aiming at racial discrimination  
(as of 2014)**

**Article 1 – Incitement to violence or hatred**

- (1) “Anyone, **who publicly incites, provokes, or stirs**, either orally or through the press, the Internet, or any other means, **acts of violence** or hatred against a person or group of persons or a member of such a group defined by reference to race, color, religion, descent or national or ethnic origin, sexual orientation, gender identity, or disability, in a manner that endangers the public order and exposes the life, physical integrity, and freedom of persons defined above to danger, will be punished by imprisonment of from three months to three years and a fine of €5,000 to €20,000.
- (2) Anyone, who publicly **incites, provokes, or stirs**, either orally or through the press, the Internet, or any other means, **acts of destruction against the assets** of a person or group of persons defined by reference to race, color, religion, descent or national or ethnic origin, sexual orientation, gender identity, or disability, in a manner that endangers the public order and exposes the life, physical integrity, and freedom of persons defined above to danger, will be punished by imprisonment of from three months to three years and a fine of €5,000 to €20,000.
